


Wickersley School and SportSollege Uniform Policy

1. Introduction

Wickersley Partnership Trust (WPT) believes that school uniform allows equality and fairness for all, and that it prepares young people for the world of work. Uniform has a positive influence on student behaviothelps to foster a calm and businesiste atmosphere, whilst also eliminating the social stigma of what can be extremely expensive fashion trends.

Following a public consultation in 2023, and working closely with alestadders,WPTwill implement a standard uniform across all secondary schools from September 2024, with each school retaining its individual school colours and logo.

This policyoutlines uniform expectations for all students attending the school. It aims t

- x Set outclearly our expectation for school uniform

2. Uniform Roles and Responsibilities

- x Is implemented fairly across school

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
- x Limiting items with distinctive characteristics to koost and/or longlasting items
